I am looking forward to seeing you all soon, and showing you all my new skills!

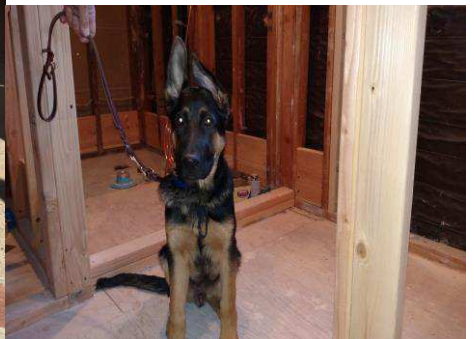

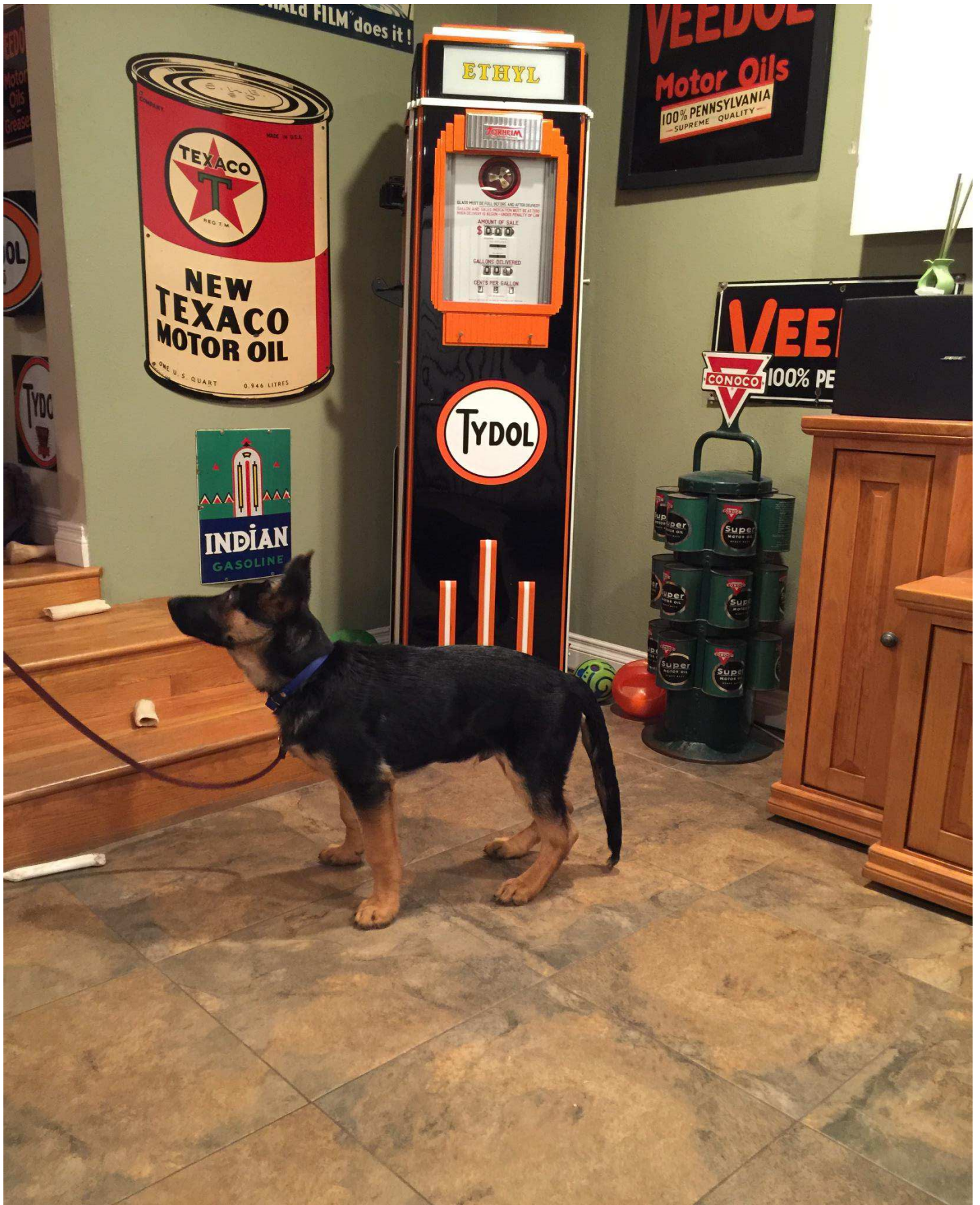
