She majored in something other than Treat Training, which kind of confused me, and it took her FOUR YEARS to finish. She must be a little slow, so I was extra nice to her.









I honestly have no idea what it is.




Apparently, this obedience thing never really ends! As long as Mom has the bag of

Doing what Paddy does best. If there's a puddle, Paddy will find


