It's not just all work being a Guide Dog puppy-in-training!



My first five weeks with my puppyraising family have really flown by. I've grown so much in this short time. I now weigh 22 pounds and am getting really long and solid!

As a puppy in training, it is really important that I get well socialized, develop good manners, and have good obedience skills. Even when I'm in the car, I am learning that I should lie down in the front seat near the passenger's feet (that's where my blind parter will need me to sit when I'm working!). Every month, we will attend our GDA meetings where I learn about all kinds of things. My first meeting is coming up soon! I am excited about seeing all of the other dogs, but I don't get to play with them as I'm in jacket, and I need to exhibit self-control (that's the ticket!).

I went to my first GDA puppy obedience class where we got to walk on different textures, climb up different types of stairs, and see unusual objects. It was so much fun and I really did well. My mom says I'm super-smart! And best of all eight of the nine from my litter attended.

I am still in the middle of my puppy kindergarten call. Once completed, I will also take obedience classes. In those classes, they will work on more advanced commands and also, it will be
