
HOLIDAY SEASON:

And every few weeks there has been a holiday or some other interesting event punctuating our activities. Lots of fun adventures and

October started off with a just-me-anddad couple of days in Big Bear, my first only-dog adventure. We hit a couple of fast-foods and had a few nice walks at the park, and I had a lot of fun making sure I was the center of attention at his monthly volunteer meeting. down to Simi, several mall walks. and a walkabout with lots of fellow pups in training. 



Looking forward to lots of dining and shopping and sights to see for Thanksgiving and Christmas and New Years, my first day and overnight stays at Camp-GDA, helping my raisers with a crazy level of Christmas decorating, and driving around in the evenings to enjoy the Christmas lights. It sure did sound like fun!

November indeed saw lots of lunches and play dates with friends and family, a puppy-in-training walkabout, lots of mall walks, two half days and an overnight at Camp-GDA, and a day trip up to Big Bear. My housemate Akira turned 11 years old, I had walks at Descanso Gardens and the Ventura

Promenade, and Frankie spent a weekend with us. But then.....

The weekend before Thanksgiving, the day I turned 11 months old, I started my first heat. Off I go to GDA for three to four weeks. Luckily I had just done several short stays at Camp-GDA so I was comfortable there, and my raiser visited me. They told me they would



keep busy doing some puppy sitting while I was gone, and that I should be home by mid-December, so I would still get to do some of the fun Christmas and New Years stuff.

I had a fine three weeks at Camp-GDA, and tested as being done with heat 12/16 and ready to go. However, GDA had several cases of respiratory issues in the kennels while I was there, and though I have not shown any symptoms they strongly recommended I do a 30-day isolation from other GDA dogs in a dog-free home so as not to expose other dogs. So I am now with puppy sitters



Sheri and Veronica and their cat up in Canyon Country, and my 30-day isolation will be up in mid-January, assuming no symptoms develop.



Now, isolation fortunately does not mean I am housebound. I can still be taken out in public to do things, I just cannot come into contact with other dogs. So Sheri and Veronica still take me grocery shopping and to church and what-not, and I have a new house and yard to explore, and a kitty to try and make

Several days later they nabbed me for my first birthday (12/22), and we had a pleasant afternoon strolling around Valencia Town Center Mall. Then they came and nabbed me for a fun day viewing the gorgeous Rose Parade floats in Pasadena -- but you will have to wait for my next report to see those pictures!



So, I am now a full year old, a gorgeous girl at about 57 pounds. I have a lot of energy but have matured and settled, am very sweet (Sheri and Veronica adore me!), and absolutely love going out and about, and my folks say I am one of the best dogs they have had the pleasure of raising for GDA. I can't wait



to get home and get back into the swing of things!

As for what is coming up next quarter, obviously January starts off with the Rose Parade Floats. Hopefully I stay symptom free, and will be able to return home mid-January. Late January and February I will have my medical checks (hip and elbow x-rays,

eyes, and heart) so that expert GDA|TLC staff can determine if I will be a breeder or a working guide/service dog. I look forward to playing again with Akira and Abby and Riley, and continuing a busy schedule of varied public outings such as restaurants and stores and malls, gardens and parks and beaches, GDA|TLC events

and meetings, museums and other crowded venues, and public transportation. Everything is so much fun, give me MORE!


