As you can see, I got to watch them pick out the apples to make fresh apple cider with! It was fascinating!! I was a good boy, though, and didn't take any samples.









We went to a Christmas concert and listened to a lot of singing!! I got to wear a big, red Christmas bow there and everyone thought it was really cute!

This is me in front of the Guide Dogs of America sign. One day, I will represent this organization as a fully-trained guide dog!


















On the last day of 2014, it snowed!!! I never have seen snow before and it was so exciting! Who knew all that cold, white stuff could be so fun!!
