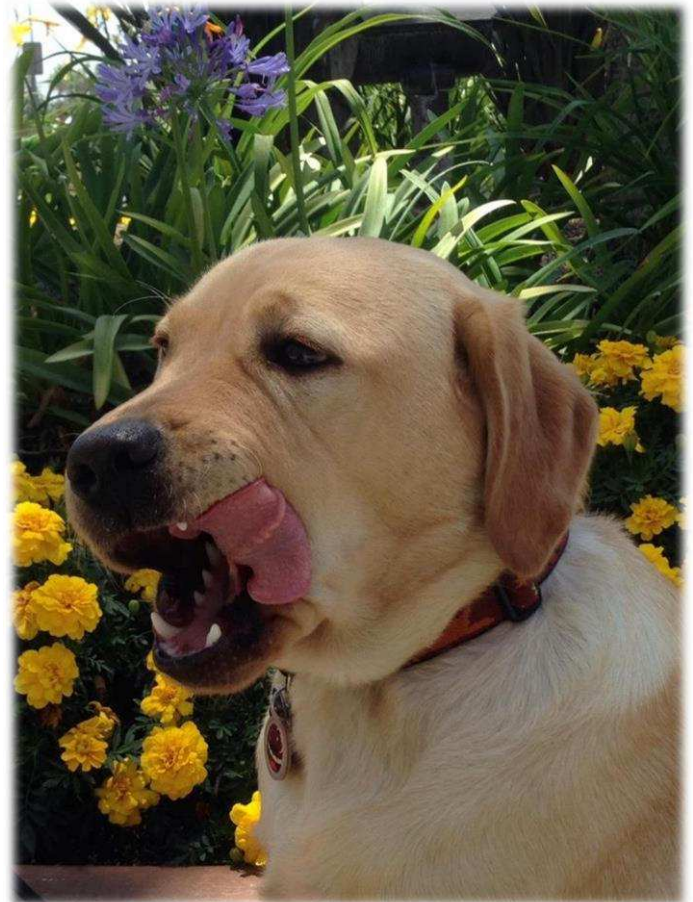

They wanted to dress me up.



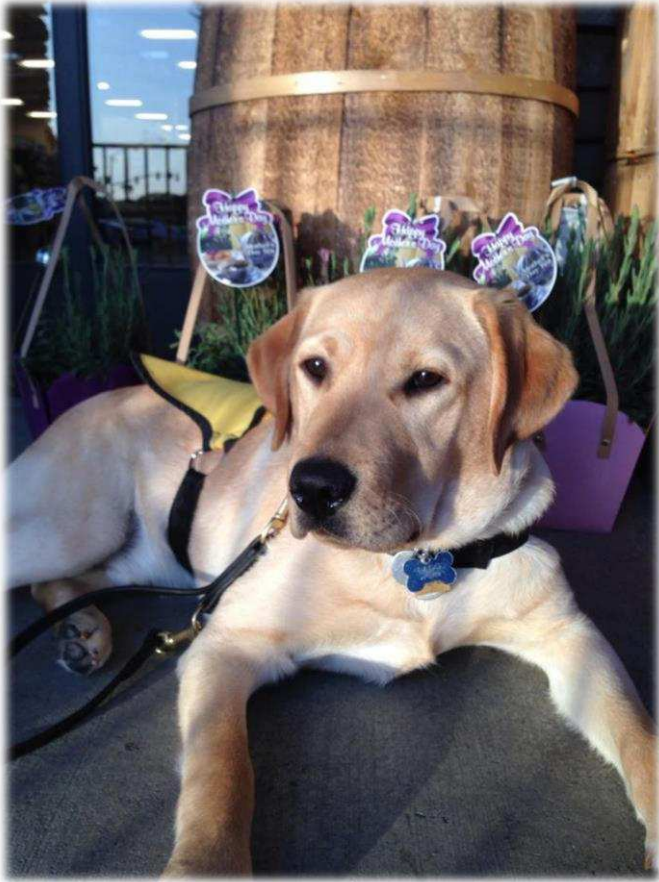
They came in droves to pet me!

Paisley and I went to a sporting event, Dock Dogs, which she loves to do. Mom put me on a long line and I got to swim in the muddy pond ~ FUN!



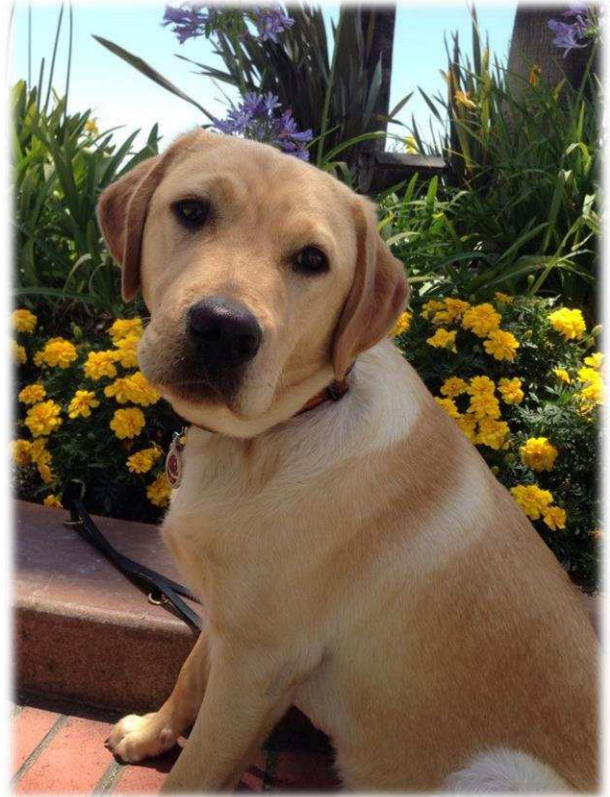
During VisionWalk we went into the stadium. We took photo break because it was HOT!



We participated in VisionWalk 2014 at the Anaheim Stadium with the Orange County Group. We manned (pupped?) the booth and walked a 5k.

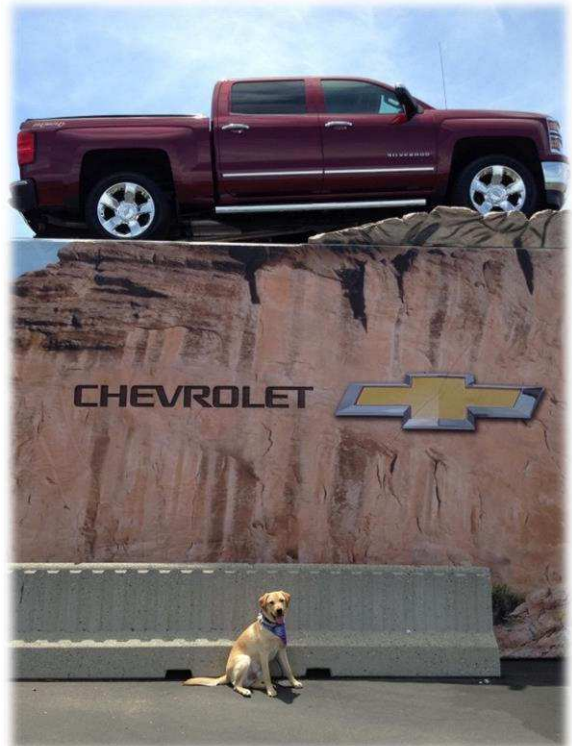


Many people were snapping pictures of me here. I must be famous!

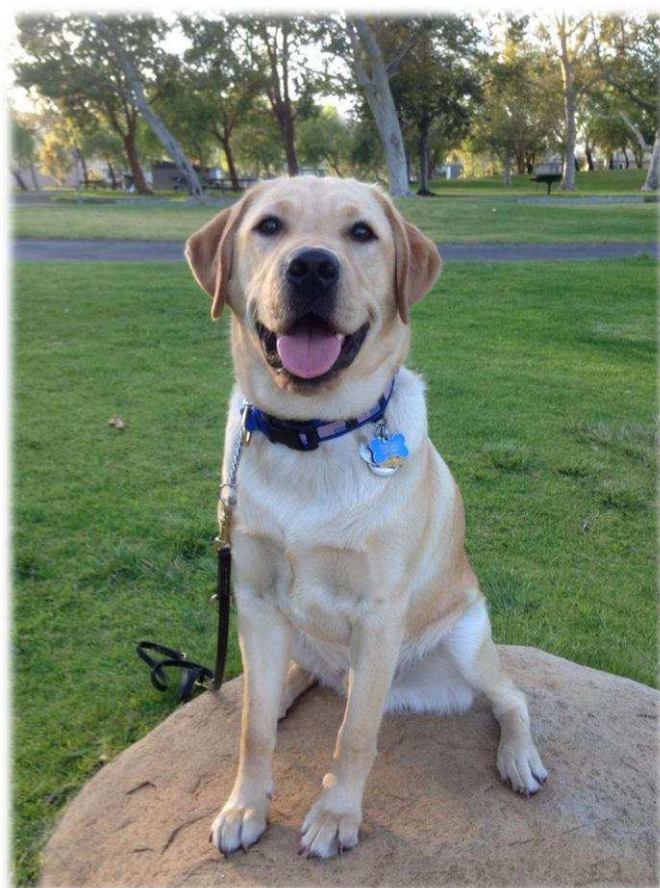
Everyone thought I was getting so big until they saw this picture of me!

I didn't take any! Yay for me!



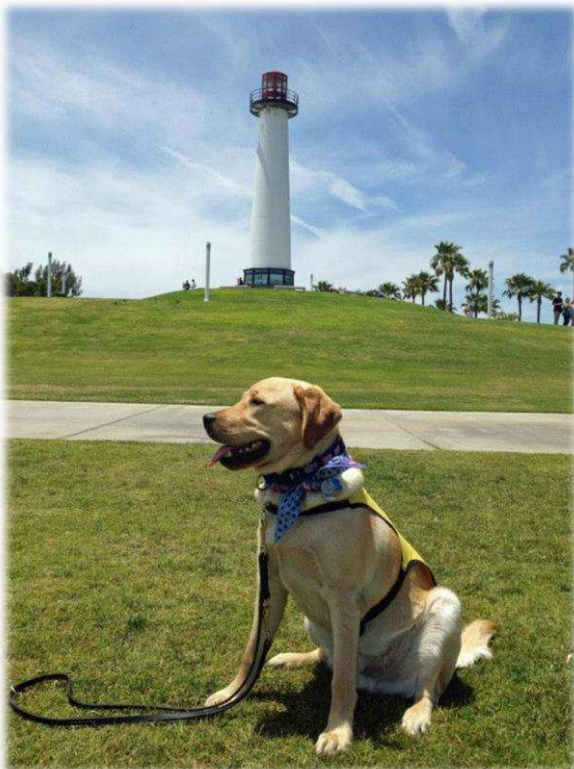
